CONVERSATION & FLUENCY

- **HOW AND WHERE TO FIND A GERMAN CONVERSATION PARTNER**

Chatting with a language partner online might be the most entertaining and overall best way to learn German. Work on various skills, from speaking and pronunciation to vocab and listening, and even culture and confidence. PRONUNCIATION

- **FORVO**

A pronunciation "dictionary" can be very useful, especially for languages like German, which has quite a few sounds that don't exist in English, like the o-umlaut (ö). Forvo is populated through crowdsourcing. That means users like you can submit recordings, and as a result there are often several accents to choose from.

READING & WRITING

NEWSPAPERS & OTHER MEDIA

- **NEWSPAPER MAP**

Read the news from any country in the world. Choose "German," then pick any city on the map for a link to their local news site.

- **BILD-ZEITUNG**

The most-read daily paper in Germany, Bild-Zeitung is a tabloid that reports on scandals, crimes, affairs and politics.

- **DIE SÜDDEUTSCHE ZEITUNG**

A national newspaper that leans center left, and the second largest daily paper in Germany by circulation.

- **FRANKFURTER ALLGEMEINE ZEITUNG**

FAZ is a daily newspaper which has about 360,000 readers per day. Politically, it leans center-right but is known for excellent reporting.

- **DIE WELT**

This newspaper sells about 190,000 copies a day.

- **DIE TAGESZEITUNG (TAZ)**

"Tageszeitung" means "the daily paper" in German.
